We have learned that our March visit is greatly anticipated by the children and staff at the Children of Zion Village. **There is a picture of Auntie Lorna and Uncle Travis up in the main room of the children's home** that the children often stop to check out! On Sunday mornings during church service there is a part where

the kids write down prayer requests, and the children always put us on the list.

Prayer request – the Zambezi River is rising and threatening to flood the orphanage. The local government and the orphanage are working together to identify appropriate alternative locations to evacuate the orphanage if needed. **Please pray that our kids do need to evacuate.** The picture below is from a previous flood on the Zambezi River. 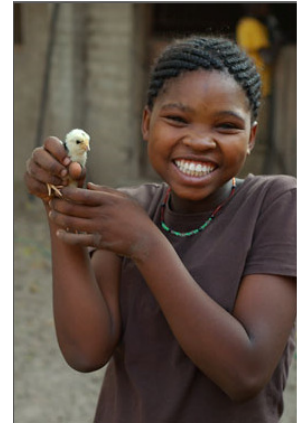




Support Status

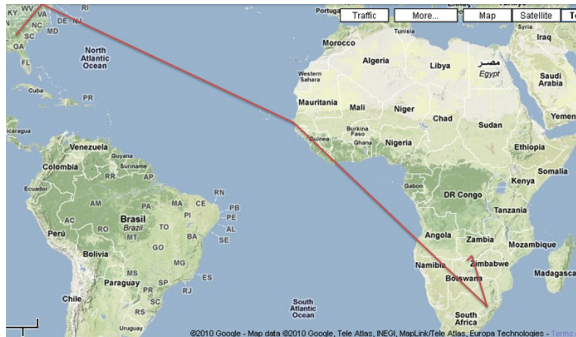
