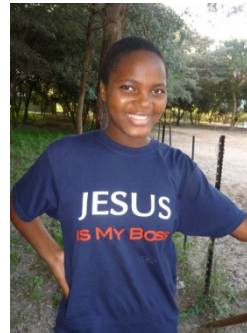
tlc Updates

The water has finally stopped rising and the anticipated evacuation was avoided – praise the Lord! However the boat is currently nonfunctional which means access to the property is cutoff. The kids will continue their school break as the teachers cannot get to the village.

Support Status

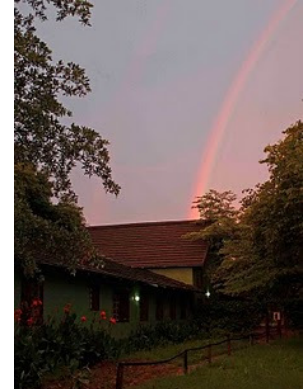
